Breathe easier! Enjoy a smoke-free Anderson! The City of Anderson has responded to community concerns from local businesses, athletic organizations, parents, community-based organizations and youth. The message from residents was that 80% of Anderson residents do not smoke, and all were concerned about secondhand smoke where people work and play. In response, Anderson City Council approved an outdoor secondhand smoke ordinance in line with the City's family friendly values and priority to protect the health of children and residents. The law went into effect on November 4, 2011.

Why building entryways?

Smoke-free entryway policies are good for business. They protect residents and children who cannot avoid smoke-filled air at entrances to buildings where they do business. A poll of Shasta County residents found that 84% favor a law that restricts smoking at business entryways.

Why recreation areas and community events?

Smoke-free recreation area and community event policies are good for community health. A safe, smoke-free environment is important at our parks and events because of the number of youth-oriented activities. Also, they keep parks and events free from tobacco litter.

How do I report a violation?

Community members may report violations of the policy by calling the Tobacco Violation and Information Hotline at (530) 225-5052.
