MANDATORY RECYCLING REQUIREMENTS

Effective July 1, 2012, California Assembly Bill 341 **requires** any business, non-profit organization, governmental agency, or multi-family complex with five or more units generating **4 or more cubic yards** of solid waste per week to implement a recycling program.

Effective January 1, 2017, California Assembly Bill 1826 **requires** any business, non-profit organization, governmental agency, or multi-family complex with five or more units generating **4 or more cubic yards** of organic materials* per week to collect and recycle those materials.

* Organic materials include yard trimmings, food waste, and non-treated wood waste.

Our records show that your business or property is subject to one or both of these requirements, but may not be participating in a recycling program.

How Can My Business or Housing Complex Comply With the Law

• Participate in Curbside Collection

⇒ Businesses located in the unincorporated areas of central Shasta County and the cities of Anderson and Shasta Lake, can sign up for Waste Management, Inc.'s curbside recycling collection service. Businesses located in the Cities of Anderson and Shasta Lake can sign up for Waste Management, Inc.'s yard waste curbside collection service.

• Haul Your Recyclables to a Recycling Facility

Bring organic materials to:

- ⇒ City of Redding Transfer Station - Accepts untreated/unpainted/unstained lumber and wood, and yard trimmings.
- ⇒ Wheelabrator Shasta, 20811 Industry Rd., Anderson. Accepts tree tops, limbs, woody yard waste, pallets and crates, logging slash, clean scrap lumber, plywood, and particle board.

- **Grasscycle** - Leave grass clippings on your lawn when mowing. Clippings decompose quickly, returning valuable nutrients back to the soil.
- **Mulch** - Use leaves and pine needles as mulch. Mulching controls weeds, conserves moisture, and reduces soil erosion.
- **Compost** - Composting is a very basic process. Simply put yard trimmings and food scraps in a pile and let nature do the rest. Contact us for a free how-to guide.
